Julie Billiart Opens Westlake School

In August, Julie Billiart School in Westlake welcomed 44 students to the newest campus of Julie Billiart Schools (JBS). JB schools are designed to support children with mild to moderate autism, ADD/ADHD, anxiety, dyslexia and other learning differences. This school year, the newest Julie Billiart school opened to grades K-4 and will open to JBS's full model of K-8 in the fall of 2022 with the capacity to serve 132 students. "For years, we have thoughtfully considered and planned for this expansion of our family of schools," said Lannie Davis-Frecker, President and CEO of Julie Billiart Schools. "We know that JB's whole-child approach and expertise in special education will enhance the educational landscape in this community, and we're blessed to be able to bring the JB Way to families on the West Side," she continued.

Opening a new school bucks the trend seen nationwide in Catholic schools, where the National Catholic Education Association reports a 6.4% decline in Catholic school enrollment between the fall of 2019 and the beginning of families to reach goals for each student. The "JB Way" represents the unique qualities and characteristics of St. Julie Billiart herself, setting JB schools apart from many private and public schools.

In addition to the Westlake school, Julie Billiart Schools has campuses in Lyndhurst and Akron, Ohio. The community of schools strives to build self-confidence, inspire Christian values and empower students with skills, knowledge and enthusiasm for life-long learning through small

class sizes, onsite specialized therapies and highly experienced intervention specialists.

The forked cross, or Gabelkreuz as it is known in German, portrays the crucifix as the Tree of Life, showing God taking on our great human suffering. Such crucifixes were found throughout the towns and villages of Northern Germany and, in particular, at the parish church of St. Lamberti in Coesfeld, Germany. It was in prayer before the Coesfeld Crucifix that Hilligonde Wolbring and Elisabeth Kuhling came to the decision to continue their caring mission as the fist Sisters of Notre Dame. This is why the Coesfeld Crucifix has special meaning for the Sisters of Notre Dame throughout the world.

St. Claire Receives Assistance in COVID-19 Fight

At the request of the state of Kentucky, the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services deployed a team of medical professionals from its National Disaster Medical System (NDMS) to St. Claire HealthCare (SCH) to safely care for the surge of COVID-19 patients at St. Claire Regional Medical Center in Morehead, KY. A Disaster Medical Assistance Team (DMAT) is part of the NDMS, which helps communities respond to and recover from public health emergencies and disasters. During a 14-day period, DMAT provided help from a medical officer, physician assistant, nurse practitioner, supply officer, respiratory therapist, four registered nurses and three paramedics.

FEMA (Federal Emergency Management Agency) EMS (Emergency Medical Services) strike teams also assisted St. Claire with transfers and transporting COVID-19 patients. Each team is comprised of five advanced life support ambulances, and each ambulance is staffed with one paramedic and one emergency medical technician (EMT).

In addition, members of the Kentucky Army National Guard have been at St. Claire since September 1 and are helping with non-clinical logistical tasks throughout St. Claire Regional Medical Center, including assisting security, the stock room, and pharmacy. According to the staff at St. Claire, these soldiers hit the ground running and helped open an expanded COVID unit on their very first day! "We will make sure we're doing whatever it takes to care for our patients in this extraordinary time of need," said Donald H. Lloyd, II, SCH President/CEO.



The Kentucky Army National Guard has been working alongside the SCH team, providing non-clinical assistance whenever and wherever needed. When eight of the soldiers ended their duties at SCH, they were honored with a reception and presented with the Spirit of St. Claire Award in recognition of their dedication to St. Claire HealthCare and the mission to serve.

"Begin with the Child": The Life and Work of Sister Mary Marguerite McArdle, SND, by Eileen Quinlan, SND. Influenced by the whole-child pedagogies of the Sisters of Notre Dame, the Progressive Movement, and the Education Department of the Catholic University of America, Sister Mary Marguerite McArdle, SND, was an expert in teaching reading and in preparing primary teachers at Catholic University and Cleveland's St. John College. She founded Julie Billiart School in Cleveland for children with

special learning needs, edited the MINE magazines, and wrote the primary-level readers in the Faith and Freedom series produced by Ginn Publishing and the Catholic University of America from 1942-1969. Her balanced and forward-looking approach to life and teaching made her an influential figure in 20th century Catholic education.

Book of Ruth: A Tale of Great Loves, by Sr. Mary Kathleen Glavich, SND. The touching biblical story of Ruth is ageless and well loved. For millennia, she has been viewed as a paragon of faithful love. At weddings her commitment is repeated: "Where you go, I will go..." Ruth addressed these words not to either husband but to her mother-in-law, Naomi. Using imagination and what is known about the era, Sr. Kathleen expands upon this timeless story with insights into what the characters likely thought and did, bringing



them to life. Love is the dominant theme in the book of Ruth, above all, God's never-ending love for his people.

Lisa Canterbury Takes on New Role

After five years of service with the NSNO/NEO, Assistant Director Lisa Canterbury has taken a position with Life Act, a non-profit providing programming to middle school and high school students about depression awareness and suicide prevention. In her time with the NEO/NSNO she helped organize the 2018 National Education Summit as well as numerous regional gatherings, EAC meetings, and leadership meetings.
