

Two SNDs from India are currently living at Notre Dame Center while they attend graduate classes at California Lutheran University. Sr. Pramila Hembrom (on the left) is pursuing an MA in Educational Leadership, while Sr. Archana Joseph (on the right) is studying for a MS in Counseling with an emphasis on student support services.

In this global experience, Sr. Archana has already noticed the impact of context, culture and demographics as significant influences in various educational settings. Both sisters are learning new tools to be adapted to India's ministry realities.

This cross-cultural exchange also provides opportunities for personal and spiritual renewal. In observing parish life, they note the joy and freedom in expressing one's faith publicly.

Sr. Pramila said that "it is a privilege to study in the USA." She appreciates getting acquainted with the sisters and learning from their life-long ministries and wisdom. Sr. Archana commented "I am inspired by how the sisters continue serving with grace, despite some age-related physical limitations."

The SNDs first went to India from Cleveland, Ohio in 1949 and many California donors will remember the missionaries' stories from those early years. Care for Creation Corner ~ with Santa!


As Santa's elves this Christmas, we might consider gifts that show our care for creation... <u>Here are some suggestions</u> for celebrating a more sustainable Christmas.
