Dear Friends,

Continuing the Lenten journey, we have the opportunity to reflect on the gifts of faith and hope which are central to our spiritual lives. We recognize that faith truly is a gift, but a gift that we can strengthen and deepen through our daily choices. Within the Church, this Jubilee Year of 2025 is intended to be a time of hope for a world facing many chaotic challenges: violence, effects of a pandemic, climate change, and economic and social uncertainty.

From our own spiritual journeys, we know that faith and hope are deeply intertwined, with faith providing the foundation for hope, and hope being the confident expectation of what faith believes: eternal life as our ultimate happiness.

As Sisters of Notre Dame, we are consecrated for mission in the Church, placing special emphasis on catechesis (handing on the faith) so that others may grow in faith and confidence in God. Handing on the faith is central to each of our ministries, but especially for the SNDs and Associates who coordinate and support the OCIA (Order of Christian Initiation for Adults) within several parishes.

Over 35 years of service in this ministry, Sr. Joyanne Sullivan has discovered powerful questions she asks the seekers: "Why are you here? To get the ticket punched so you can have a Catholic wedding? Or are you here to develop a lifelong deeper relationship with Jesus?" Many of the seekers are first responders or medical professionals who need to work nights. Sr. Joyanne and her team have developed a program that adapts to their availability, including Zoom sessions. During high fire season, a fireman seeker could not leave the station, so he joined remotely. As it turned out, all of the fireman at the station joined the discussion, including one who had been away from the Church for 25 years. The seeker fireman was an evangelizing disciple, enabling a colleague to grow in faith and confidence in God! Even in the midst of chaotic challenges, faith and hope are growing through the power of the Spirit! Be sure to read more about Sr. Joyanne's ministry.

Thank you to each of our partners whose encouragement and support sustains our ministerial outreach. With these reflections, we pray that this coming month is a time of renewed faith and hope, but also a time of peace and joy!


FROM THE CALIFORNIA GRAPEVINE
